Course Description:

This course will cover the fundamentals of primate behaviour, research and theory including: evolution, social dynamics, sociobiology, socioecology, dominance, aggression, kinship, sexual behaviour, reproductive strategies, cognition & communication, and conservation

Required Textbook: Primate Behavioural Ecology. Karen Strier, 11th Edition (2011)

COURSE REQUIREMENTS:

Term Test 1: May 28 (30%) – This test will be a combination of multiple choice and short answer format and will cover all preceding lecture materials (including videos) and chapters 1 - 3 of the text book.

Term Test 2: June 11 (30%) - This test will be a combination of multiple choice and short answer format (same as Term Test 1) and will cover all lecture materials (and videos) since Term Test 1 and chapters 4 - 8 of the text book.

Cumulative Final Exam: Registrar scheduled (40%) - This test will also be a combination of multiple choice and short answer format and will cover all lecture and textbook materials since the beginning of class, with an emphasis on materials discussed since Term Test 2 and chapters 9 - 12 of the text book.
